On the evening of July 27, 2024, Edward "Ted" Wacker, of Coaldale, passed away peacefully at the age of 97 years.

Ted took great pride in his farm work, farm machinery, trucks and projects that he built.

In addition to grain farming, he delivered milk to people and owned 2400 chickens. He took the eggs to the local egg grading station where he met his future wife, Lillian Jantz. Ted also enjoyed going to Pioneer Acres yearly show in Irricana, Alberta in August. He would explain all the details of the old machinery to whoever was with him, and he even brought his fifth wheel holiday trailer one year to have a place to rest and eat with Ed and Doreen in tow

Ted was predeceased by his wife Lillian, and nephew Dale Penner.
